

TAP Release MB33 and Hot Fix 1

Issue	Resolution															
After a program submits a week for payment in KC, the system does not allow the program and/or sponsors to enter any more attendance for that week or month correctly. This includes if the existing authorization did not cover all of the days of the week/month at the time of submission for payment and a second authorization is backdated after covering the remaining days in the week/month. For this scenario, if any changes are needed to attendance and/or payment, the program must submit a payment alert request. The user actions needed for this scenario are different from the steps for backdated authorizations that cover a full week/month where the users can enter backdated attendance and should not submit a payment alert request which causes confusion.	The Submit Weekly and Monthly Attendance QRC was updated to give programs clearer instruction on the steps that need to be completed to request payment for this scenario.															
Users are unable to enter or correct some attendance for children with monthly authorizations in some situations for months which are longer than 4 weeks.	The Enter Weekly and Monthly Attendance and The Submit Weekly and Monthly Attendance QRCs were updated to give programs clearer instruction on the steps that need to be completed to successfully include complete and accurate attendance information for payment calculation.															
The Overlapping Care Report is not working as efficiently as desired. For accurate results, users must enter the same beginning and end date in the date fields before generating the report and generate the report for each date in which they are reviewing for overlapping attendance. This does mean if the user is reviewing for a week the report should be generated seven (7) times, once for each day of the week.	Users are now able to use a date span in the date fields instead of the same date for both date fields when using the Overlapping Care Report. This means the report only needs generated one time for the timespan the user wishes to review.															
Programs are selecting school sessions out on Saturdays and Sundays for children in error. Ohio does not have school schedules which include weekends, and this selection should not be made for children on Saturdays and Sundays.	The 'School Session Out' option will be visible in the dropdown but will be disabled so programs will no longer be able to make that selection on weekend days.															
The minimum and maximum hours on the Authorization/Payment categories need to be updated effective 11/2/2025. However, these hours do not reflect the actual hours of care as defined by ECE policy. The hours displayed on the ECE authorization in the TAP system should not impact the ECE grantee due to payment being issued outside the TAP system for the ECE services based on ECE policies.
